TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE: 74 This person is defensive and guarded regarding self-disclosure. Truth-Corrected scale scores should be accurate, however, there is the possibility of some distortion. A conscious or perhaps subconscious attempt to present self in an overly favorable light is evident. Denial and resistance to further inquiry and self-report can be anticipated. This individual is self-protective and minimizing self-report information.

ALCOHOL SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE: 95 Al cohol use is out of control. Check if a recovering (al cohol problem, but has stopped drinking) al coholic. If abstaining, establish how long the client has been recovering. Relapse risk is very high. RECOMMENDATIONS: If recovering, continue treatment or involvement in Al coholics Anonymous (AA). Options include: intensive outpatient treatment, inpatient treatment, chemical dependency treatment, and/or AA. This client may be out of control. This is a maximum risk score.

DRUGS SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE

Many self-report indicators of drug use or abuse are evident. Either drug use is not controlled or this person is "recovering" (drug problem, but has stopped using). Serious drug-related problems are indicated. Relapse risk is high. RECOMMENDATIONS: Monitored chemical dependency treatment could be helpful. Prior convictions for drug-related offenses would upgrade treatment and supervision. Supplemental attendance at Narcotics Anonymous (NA) or Cocaine Anonymous (CA) might be considered.

RISK SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE

Several indicators of risk, e.g., anger, temper and hostility, are evident. This individual has the potential to be a danger to self and/or others. Problem risk scorers may require more structure and closer supervision. Threatening, assaultive or violence-related priors would upgrade supervision. This Risk Scale score represents problem risk.

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS: The answers are the client's self-reported responses. And, they represent direct admissions or unusual responses, which may help in understanding the client's situation.
